

Atopic Dermatitis Treatments Steps

Note that not all patients will necessarily reach the last step of treatment.

Some combinations are possible.

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PHOTOTHERAPY

2-3x / week Effective in 4-6 weeks Specific UV rays



MEDICATIONS SOMETIMES USED

Methotrexate

Weekly

Blood tests several times a year Side effects: digestive, mild immunosuppression Pregnancy not advised during the treatment Combined with a vitamin

Neoral/cyclosporine

2x / day

Used max 2 years at a time Blood tests and bloodpressure monitoring Side effects: immunosuppression Pregnancy not advised during the treatment

Prednisone

For acute crisis
Notable side effects



BIOLOGICS AND INNOVATIVE TREATMENTS (in general, very effective)

Tablets - JAK inhibitor

- Rinvoq (Upadacitinib) & Cibingo (Abrocitinib)
- 1 tablet once a day
- Blood test to be done before and during
- From 12 vears old and u
- Vaccination update
- Certain contraindications (see your doctor)
- Pregnancy not advised during treatment

Subcutaneous injections

- Dupixent (Dupilumab)*
 Adtralza (Tralokinumab)
 - upixent (Dupitumus) Autruiza (Traioki
- Blocks IL-4 and IL-13 Blocks
- Injection every 2 weeks Injection every 2
- (4 weeks if 15 to 29 kg) From 12 year

*Reimbursed with RAMQ if:

- Significant Eczema
- Failed to:
- 2 strong cortisone creams + Protopic® or Elidel®
- Failure of phototherapy or if not possible

FOR CIBINQO AND RINVOQ: failure of a 4-month trial of an alternative eczema medication
