

Psoriasis Treatments Steps

Note that not all patients will necessarily reach the last step of treatment.

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1-2x / day Creams, lotions, ointments, gels, shampoos, foam Cortisone, vitamin D or a combination of the two

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MEDICATION

Three options (must be taken for minimum 3 months)

Soriatane/acitretin (derivative of vitamin A) Daily Blood tests several times a year Side effects: dryness, hair loss, changes in cholesterol levels Pregnancy not advised until 3 years after the treatment Has no effect on arthritis

Methotrexate

Weekly Blood tests several times a year Side effects: digestive, mild immunosuppression Pregnancy not advised during the treatment Combined with a vitamin

Neoral/cyclosporine (more effective) 2x / day Used max 2 years at a time Blood and blood pressure tests Side effects: Very few, immunosuppression Pregnancy not advised during the treatment

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BIOLOGICS AND INNOVATIVE TREATMENTS

Tablets

Apremilast 2x / day
Side effects: digestion, weight loss, depression
Sotyktu 1x / day : few side effects

Subcutaneous injections

Several medications available Self-injection or with assistance Administration frequency: from 2x / week to every 3 months Significant chances of improvement, approximately 80% Recommended vaccination Few side effects: redness at the injection site, relative immunosuppression

Reimbursed if:

2/3 of the aforementioned medications have failed to yield satisfactory results over a three-month period or intolerance or contraindications

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Moderate to severe generalized psoriasis or on the hands/feet, face, genitals

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Turnkey service with nurse and assistance program adapted to the patient

2 PHOTOTHERAPY

2-3x / week Treatment only takes a few minutes Effective in 4-6 weeks Specific UV rays for psoriasis
